

## OUR PROGRESS

Our volunteers play a critical role in the progress we are making toward our goal to improve patient outcomes and double pancreatic cancer survival. Every achievement, every milestone and every step toward more awareness is in large part because of the passion and dedication of our volunteers.



Since the organization's founding in 1999, NCI funding for pancreatic cancer has increased 800 percent.



The five-year pancreatic cancer survival rate has increased by three percentage points since 2014.



82 percent of every dollar donated goes toward our patient and caregiver programs.



We led the efforts to pass the Recalcitrant Cancer Research Act, which created a scientific framework for pancreatic cancer, outlining four national research priorities that are being funded by the National Cancer Institute. The bill also focuses national attention on the disease.



Precision Promise<sup>SM</sup> is our groundbreaking initiative to dramatically improve outcomes for pancreatic cancer patients through a transformative, patient-centric clinical trial and research platform that continuously and rapidly evaluates novel treatment options.




Patients, caregivers and healthcare professionals have called upon our organization more than 168,000 times for disease information, treatment options and hope.

We provide leading-edge patient resources like Know Your Tumor<sup>®</sup>, a precision medicine service; our Clinical Trial Finder and access to the most up-to-date and comprehensive pancreatic cancer clinical trial database in the United States; and our Patient Registry, the largest database of patient information to help advance research and improve patient care.



Through a competitive grants process, we fund groundbreaking research across the United States. Since 2003, we have awarded 167 grants to 166 researchers at 62 institutions, with a research investment totaling more than \$56 million, including our Research Grants Program and our clinical initiatives.
